I would like to thank the many volunteers who help at the library. The newly formed Friends of the Library, with over 50 members, now runs the semi-annual book sales and uses the proceeds to purchase out-of-budget items for the library. These have included chairs, lighting and a mural for the young adult room, two game systems for teen tournaments coming soon, sturdy metal bookends in adult fiction and a new Christmas tree. The Friends also help at the various programs.

We've had several students and adults, fulfilling their community service hours. They have straightened shelves, moved books, cleaned closets and worked in the children's room.

I would like to thank Peggy Merinar, recently retired from the Board, having served 13 years very active in the library expansion, many library policy revisions and fundraising efforts, for all her hard work.
